



## KIDS FIRST SCREENING, ENROLLMENT AND PAYMENT SCHEMA



Child/parent(s) presents at the school for Kindergarten Round-up.

Child is insured and has been screened by his/her primary medical practitioner (child's health home), using the HealthCheck protocol.



Child/parent(s) presents at the school for Kindergarten Round-up.

Child is insured but has not been screened. Parent elects to have the screen at the school site, using the HealthCheck protocol.

Community provider (private practicing doctor/ community health center physician) does screening on-site and bills insurance.

Insurance is billed for the screen at a pre-established rate based on screen type – full or modified.

*There are other billing options available; however, this is the most efficient and logical option.*



Child/parent(s) presents at the school for Kindergarten Round-up.

Child has insurance but the insurance will not pay for a well child screen.

Following are the options for children whose insurance will not pay for a well child screen:

- Limited domain screen plus height and weight without charge provided at the school site.
- The family may have a HealthCheck screen provided by their primary provider/health home at their expense.
- The family may select a participating Kids First provider from the resource directory, including using a community health center who will determine if the family/child is eligible for the sliding fee schedule.

**Caveat:** We believe all major insurers provide for wellness exams; i.e., Blue Cross Blue Shield, PEIA, etc.



Child/parent(s) presents at the school for Kindergarten Round-up.

Parent refuses to participate in health screening using the HealthCheck protocol.

Regardless of insurance status (insured/ not insured), a limited domain screen will be done as per WV Code 18-5-17.

No charge.



Child/parent(s) presents at the school for Kindergarten Round-up.

Child is uninsured. Parent agrees to on-site screening at no cost to the family. Child is screened, using the HealthCheck protocol.

Parent is given on-site access to on-line application for government sponsored health care (Title XIX/Title XXI) or the option of a hard copy application.

If the child is eligible for government sponsored health care, the bill will be paid retroactively (from application date) for the screen, with payment made to the practitioner. If ineligible, the screen will be paid for using Kids First resources (available via CHIP waiver).

Family is given an informational brochure that discusses the availability of health care in their catchment area with special attention to sliding fee schedules at community health center sites.

School health nurses and other personnel will use the medical resource guides to facilitate referrals and encourage the establishment of a "health home" for the child.
